

Job Position: Fire Extinguisher Technician/Firefighter

Job Location: Mercury, NV

The Nevada National Security Site, Fire & Rescue Department is currently seeking applications for the position of Fire Extinguisher Technician/Firefighter. This is a collective-bargaining agreement position on a 4 day – 10 hour schedule. The following are some of the assigned duties:

- Under supervision of the Fire Prevention Captain, perform fire extinguisher maintenance operations, fire prevention activities, and maintenance of assigned apparatus and equipment.
- Perform hydrostatic testing of cylinders to include self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA), and recover/recycle and recharge clean, dry, and wet type extinguisher agents.
- Prepare and maintain various fire extinguisher and SCBA inspection, testing, and maintenance records.
- Participate in fire department training programs and maintains required skill levels in fire suppression tactics, methods, procedures, emergency medical procedures, and may provide training to other fire suppression personnel.
- Respond to fire alarms with fire company, and performs fire suppression activities including; laying and connecting hose lines, operating nozzles to apply water streams on fires, operating hand extinguishers, and using ladders, ropes, axes, and other tools and equipment; and performing ventilation, extinguishment, overhaul, and salvage activities.
- May drive ambulances to transport sick and injured persons to medical care facilities and assist Paramedics with patient treatment.
- Knowledge, compliance, and application of Company Procedures, F&R Desktop Instructions, and Organizational Procedures.
- Additional duties may be required to meet operational and training requirements as assigned by F&R Chief, Fire Marshal, and Deputy Fire Chiefs.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

All applicants must have the following qualifications; Firefighter II, Current EMT-Basic and Hazardous Materials Technician certifications. Incident Command System (ICS) 100, 200, 300, 700 and a valid driver's license. Applicants must also have a current Candidate Physical Ability Test (CPAT).

Selected applicants will be required to appear in person for a written examination and upon successful completion of the examination, participation in an oral review board (interview).
